Strategic Planning – Building Up

The 2022-2023 OCEF fiscal year continued to build upon a strategic planning foundation laid in the previous year. Quarterly Strategic Planning committee meetings served to keep the entire board focused on three key initiatives designed with our mission in mind:

Increase Awareness of OCEF:

Community and school awareness of OCEF as well as knowledge regarding what the foundation does in the community was increased through a school liaison program, increased social media presence, and attendance at community events.

Increase Revenue/Donations to OCEF

As a result of the increased awareness, OCEF was able to increase revenue by over \$16,400 from the previous year.

Increase Gifts to Oldham County Schools

The increased revenue allowed OCEF to support two additional programs, increase the gift amount for each Pyramid Award from \$1,000 to \$1,250, and create an emergency fund in our budget for unexpected requests from the District.



Community Participation Events

OCEF was able to attend and participate in two major community events at Yew Dell Botanical Gardens to help bring awareness to our foundation – Boo-Dell and Yew Dell and Yuletide.



Fundraising Events

Fundraising events help to connect OCEF and our mission to parents, teachers, staff, families and students within Oldham County Schools, as well as local businesses and donors. Fundraising is a core component of the Board's work as it supplements the grants awarded to OCEF. Grants are the bedrock of OCEF's work, and their impact are discussed later in this report.

Send Your Love

We love our teachers and staff, and what better time of year to show it than Valentine's Day! The gift offerings were expanded this year, and all options were SOLD OUT! A total of 1,200 gifts were sent to teachers and staff on Valentine's Day through the work of OCEF and its community partners – Dough Baby Donuts, Nothing Bundt Cakes, Hometown Pizza, Red Pepper Deli, and Gustavo's.

Through the generous sponsorships of Pollard Reality and First National Bank of Kentucky, OCEF was able to give **\$5,263.39** to Oldham County Schools through the Send Your Love event!





Bracket BBQ

Oldham County loves basketball and BBQ! The Rotary Clubs of LaGrange and South Oldham came together with Ameriprise Financial, Champion Chevrolet, Baptist Health LaGrange, First National Bank of Kentucky, and Wehr Constructors to make this event a success yet again. Oldham County's very own culinary program students at Arvin Center prepared the food and received many accolades. Over 65 attendees listened to a "bracketology" analysis from former U of L basketball player and current North Oldham basketball assistant coach, David Padgett. Many placed their bids in an auction for the winning teams, and selected teams at random through pool play. This event raised a net amount of **\$4,323.57** to give to the schools!



Limo Ride Raffles

After the initial success of the Limo Ride Raffle to end the 2022 school year, OCEF expanded the event and gave families an opportunity to win the raffle at the start of the 2022-2023 school year too! A group of South Oldham Middle Schoolers got a kickstart to the long weekend with a limo ride to Main Event!

The Last Day Limo Ride continued that success in May 2023, taking a group from Harmony Elementary School to Main Event on the last day of the school year.



We had numerous sponsors come out in a big way to support the Limo Ride fundraisers. Thanks to our sponsors – USI Insurance, Huntington Learning Center – East Louisville, Operation Parent, The County Press, Pollard Realty, Nick Stephens Financial Planning and Pollard Realty! Sponsorships and raffle ticket sales generated **\$7,118.21** for Oldham County Schools!



Grant-Funded Projects 2022-2023 School Year

Metro United Way and the Peyton Samuel Head Trust grants helped fund our summer literacy program, Camp Literacy Live. This program is crucial for our youngest learners who are falling behind in literacy skills and provides rising 1st graders with a 3-week camp focusing on building literacy skills.

Through an additional grant from Metro United Way and an anonymous grantor, we were able to provide take-home permanent libraries for students at La Grange Elementary. Many of these students had no books at home or limited access. Opportunities such as these provide students with an opportunity for continued literacy gains. The Kentuckiana Post of the Society of American Military Engineers provided grant funding for the Engineering Academy at the Arvin Education Center. This \$3,320.00 grant was used to purchase a class set of competition drones for our new TSA chapter at the Engineering Academy.

Thanks to a Peyton Samuel Head Trust grant, we were able to continue our popular Artist-in-Residence program. This year Oldham County Schools had an author as one of their artists-in-residence. Every year, the artist-in-residence works with OSCAC and CAPAA, as well as all schools within the district to help inspire and improve artistic expression and learning.

The Peyton Samuel Head Trust awarded a \$30,000.00 grant for the annual Pyramid Awards, as well as \$5,000.00 for OC Project Graduation.

The Buckner Related Arts program received a \$10,350.00 grant for iPads for digital art classes at Buckner Elementary School.

The South Oldham Rotary awarded a \$2,500.00 grant for Pyramid Awards.

We received a \$10,000.00 grant from Friends for Michael to upgrade the playground at Buckner Elementary, providing accessible equipment making the playground inclusive for all students.

Continued Giving

Care Solace: Dr. Jason Radford presented insightful data from student and parent surveys, along with strategic planning information and results from programs funded by OCEF to the Board of Directors. His information and discussion lead to the OCEF Board's decision to partner with Oldham County Schools and the Oldham County Health Department to fund Care Solace for the 2023-2024 school year.

\$20,000 was given by OCEF to Oldham County Schools to help keep Care Solace available for students, teachers and families for another year.





Pyramid Awards – A record-breaking \$46,545.12 was awarded through 43 Pyramid Awards to teachers and certified staff in the district.

Since the beginning of the Pyramid Awards program almost 30 years ago, teachers were eligible for up to \$1000 in award money. In 2023, the OCEF Board recognized that a thousand dollars doesn't go as far anymore, and voted to increase the maximum award to \$1,250. Due to increased awareness in the schools, and excitement regarding the award amount increase, 76 Pyramid Award applications were submitted to OCEF for review. The process included many rounds of scoring to select the top 43 applications as the ultimate winners. An awards reception was held in September 2023 to recognize the winners and their innovative classroom projects.

Extracurricular Scholarships - \$2,500

Economic pressures sometimes mean that students are left without the opportunity to participate in school-related activities that require a fee. The OCEF board recognizes the social-emotional impact that participating and being connected with one's school can have on students, and was able to reserve \$2,500 to be used to support Oldham County students who are unable to participate in school-related programs due to financial concerns. Through a partnership between OCEF and the school counselors, a general budget fund has been established, which can be used to fund student extracurricular activities. The application process was developed to protect the privacy of families in need and be simple to access.

Generous Donors

In addition to the donors already mentioned, OCEF received donations from over 300 individuals who donated over \$100 in this fiscal year. Many gave over \$1000.
